59/18	<p>H&DJBC</p> <p>59/18.01 <u>Discuss and approve correspondence from Northumberland County Council.</u> The clerk reported that Melkridge have still not agreed to Haltwhistle becoming the host council. Melkridge have suggested that they could perhaps be the host but with all the participating councils still retaining the responsibility and liability. The clerk reported a communication with Stephen Rickitt, from NALC, who quoted from the that joint committees are un-incorporated bodies and as such cannot legally own a bank account, enter into any contracts and employ staff. The Council are concerned at the length of time this is taking to be resolved and agreed to ask the clerk to write to Liam Henry at Northumberland County Council to re-iterate that they would like a host council and although it does not have to be Haltwhistle, this would be the obvious choice.</p> <p>PROPOSED Cllr E Rimmer SECONDED Cllr J Robson AGREED</p> <p>59/18.01 <u>Minutes from 16 May 2018 - the minutes were received.</u></p>
60/18	<p>Greenhead Village Hall Cllr Graham will try and get the three quotes required for painting the exterior timber and varnishing the door. However, the work will now aim to be completed in the spring next year.</p>
61/18	<p>Millennium Green The Council is the trustee of the The Millenium Green Charity. However, councillors thought it did not need to be a charity. The clerk was instructed to check this out.</p>
62/18	<p>Greenhead Play Area The Council are looking to apply for a grant from S106 as there is now some money available. However, the lease has to be clarified first. The Council agreed to ask the cemetery staff to quote for quarterly inspections and to undertake minor repairs.</p> <p>PROPOSED Cllr J Robson SECONDED Cllr M Wood AGREED</p>
63/18	<p>Footpaths The resident that inspected the footpaths is moving out of the area. The Council are looking for a volunteer to undertake this role.</p>
64/18	<p>Greenhead School The action group for the school has not been set up yet. Once it has a councillor may be invited. The children have recently been to The Sill when both Prince Charles and The Archbishop of York visited.</p>
65/18	<p>War Memorial Cllr Rimmer has found a company that can design a plaque to go on a stone which will have the names that are currently on the War Memorial inscribed onto it. This is because the current names are fading away and, as the memorial is listed, nothing can be done. Cllr Rimmer will obtain a design and size. A proposal will then be formed and a consultation with the residents undertaken probably in the new year.</p>
66/18	<p>Any Other Business The trees and bushes along the link road to the A69 were only cut on one side. Cllr Sharp will chase up getting the other side completed. There is a hedge on the A69 which is blocking the Greenhead sign and needs cutting back too. The cycle sign for Route 72 is missing so the clerk was instructed to contact Sustran to inform them. There is a drain and kerb on the bridge by the village hall that needs urgent attention. Cllr Sharp will report this. The Councillors would like to know when the safety barrier will be replaced - Cllr Sharp will find out. There is a NALC training evening on October 24th in Bywell.</p>
