Recent Scam Warnings (were Breaking News)

Longhorsley residents continue to receive scam calls and emails. Always treat unsolicited emails, calls and texts with suspicion - check with the person or company using a trusted phone number or web address. With suspicious calls, dial 1471 first to check that the call is not being intercepted, or use a different phone.

Remember that scam calls can display a telephone number that appears to be local to make the call look more genuine.

Never give out personal details or follow instructions to type commands into your PC - this could allow fraudsters to access your computer.

Recent scam calls have been from “police officers” or “bank officials” asking people to help them with a fraud investigation and from “HMRC” claiming non-payment of tax will result in legal proceedings.



Recent scam emails have been from “TV Licensing” and from one of your own email contacts saying they need a favour.

Neighbourhood Policing Team

I have been made aware of an issue in the Play Park near the Village Hall over the Bank Holiday weekend where a couple appeared to be smoking cannabis whilst sitting within the play area. If you see any suspicious activity of this nature please contact the Police immediately so that persons can be stopped and checked. This is a children’s play area and this behaviour is unacceptable and illegal.


We have not had many reports of poaching recently which may be due to the weather however there are still people out and about. A horsebox was stolen from Widdrington last week and was stopped being towed through Ashington at 4am after a brief chase. The thieves have false plates in their vehicle ready to swap onto the trailer. There have been similar crimes committed in Alnwick and Hexham areas. Please fit safety locks to any trailers or horseboxes at your property or try to block them in when not in use to prevent thefts.

Adamson Park Sycamore Tree

The planned works to fell the diseased Sycamore tree in Adamson Park will take place on Tuesday July 2nd. The park will need to be closed just for that day whilst the work is undertaken. There will also be “souvenir firewood” available from that afternoon on a “help yourself” basis.

We will be planting several varieties of replacement trees in the autumn.

Archies Pond

Environmental works, including a thorough dredging of the pond will commence in August. The works are necessary in order to clear away silt and debris which has built up over the years, which in turn causes some flooding in periods of bad weather. The Council has been successful in obtaining a grant of £955 from the Greggs Foundation towards the project.

New Flower Planters

Three new flower planters are now in situ and our thanks go to Kevin Woods for all of his hard work in choosing and planting the bright and colourful flowers which enhance the village throughout the summer months. In total, nine new planters made from recycled plastic have been purchased over the last three years to replace the old wooden ones.

Old Church Wood Trim Trail

A one kilometre distance has been measured around the outer paths round Old Church Wood and it is planned to identify this with marker posts, so people can use it to gauge fitness.

Soay Sheep on Longhorsley Moor

The Soay sheep have been doing as we hoped and grazed a large section of birch saplings on the south west side of the moor. [Photos on website]

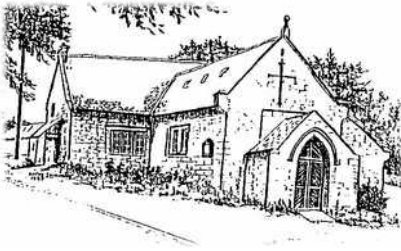

Thought for the Month

The Personal God

Albert Einstein famously said, "God does not play dice." He understood that the universe has a definite order. The Universe obeys rules, some of which he discovered, and this pointed to a God who made it. He argued with supporters of Quantum Theory because it seemed to suggest that at the atomic level there was complete chaos and he determined to look for a Universal Theory that would unite Quantum Theory with what was known about the Theory of Relativity. This, he was not able to do and, to date, no-one has. Unfortunately while Einstein believed that there was a God, he did not believe in a personal God.

At the very start of the Bible we are told of God who in the beginning created the Heavens and the Earth (Genesis c. 1v 1). On the sixth day He made man. The rest of the Bible is about how God dealt personally with the mankind he had made. In the person of Jesus of Nazareth, Christians believe He came personally into this world as a man who was God. Paul describes Jesus as God manifest in the flesh (1 Tim 3 v 16). Moreover we believe that at Calvary, Jesus the man who was God, took our sins and bore the punishment for them. Peter, the Apostle, tells us that He (Jesus) bore our sins in His body on the tree. (1 Peter c 2 v 24). He rose from the dead to show that He can free us from sin and give us a hope of eternal life. God could not be more interested in us personally if He would go to such lengths to save us from sin, despair and death.

When He was here, on Earth, Jesus went out of His way to meet all sorts of people with all sorts of problems. He was able to help everyone who came to Him. The only people He could not help were those who did not and those who would not come. The same is true of the Salvation and Eternal Life He offers. We need to go to Him. He has given us the invitation. In Matthew c 11 v 28 Jesus said, "Come to me, all who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." He wants to meet with us personally and we have to respond, each of us, individually, to that great invitation.

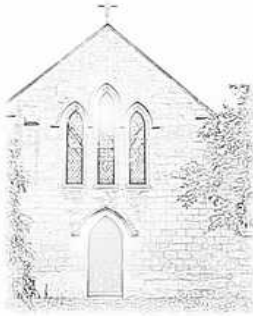

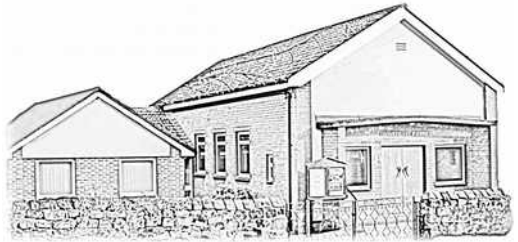

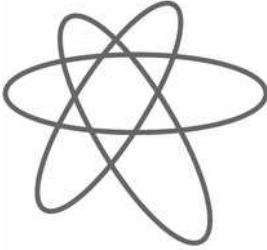
