MATTERS ARISING

CD Leyland Fund – Megan Sprot of Beal who had received £1000 from the fund had kindly written a little piece to go in the newsletter.

There are no new applications.

Traffic Calming measures in Fenwick – Mrs Murray apologised as she had not been able to contact Cllr. Lawrie to confirm and accept his generous offer so he can authorise payment, but will keep trying.

Manor House Disturbance – After the last newsletter went out where it was stated that no more disturbances had been reported to us, the clerk received emails from Mrs W Cresswell & Mrs Butler stating there had been plenty of disturbances. They had contacted the police on the night of the disturbances and emailed Mr Wilson at NCC asking about the enforcement order and whether it had been served, but again no further forward. Will contact Mr Wilson again.

Behaviour at Cheviot Trail Race - Mr McWilliams had finally replied to the clerk's email with apologies and asked if the village hall would be available to use. The Clerk replied explaining that it was now a private residence and the Parish Council thought the best way forward would be portals.

Mr McWilliams had emailed again to state that he was somewhat disappointed at the comments "limited response" from the promoters in the last newsletter. After discussion the clerk will once again reply, explaining that the responsibility rests with the organiser and that we had already advised using portals.

Local Transport Plan 2020-2021 - Priorities for Kylee Parish Council

1. Street Lighting on B6353 Fenwick to A1

Reason: There are now young children in the village who will at some point need to catch buses on the A1 to attend school. Elder residents would also benefit from lighting when using public transport especially in the Winter when nights draw in.

2. Slow written on road on B6353 prior to bend between West Kylee & Kylee Lodge

Reason: to compliment road signage included in the 2019/2020 scheme

3. Slow warning signs and slow written on the road on B6353 prior to cross roads (Black Heddon) between Kylee Lodge and Lowick

Reason: Accident in October 2018 resulted in the attendance of three air ambulances. This is a bad pull out with difficulty seeing approaching traffic on the B6353 often going at speed.

4. Convex mirror at road end of U25 with B6525

Reason: Difficult to see oncoming traffic when pulling out
