

**MINUTES OF A MEETING OF KYLOE PARISH COUNCIL HELD ON TUESDAY 17<sup>TH</sup>  
SEPTEMBER 2019 IN LOWICK VILLAGE HALL AT 7.30PM**

Chairman Mr J Hutchinson welcomed everyone to the meeting

The minutes of the last meeting were proposed as a true record by Mr D Eltringham, seconded by Mr J Yeaman and signed by the Chairman Mr J Hutchinson.

**C D LEYLAND FUND** -The Clerk had received an application for individual funding from Mrs Beverley Sprot of Beal Lodge on behalf of her daughter Megan who has been signed for her 3<sup>rd</sup> year with Sunderland Regional Talent Centre U16 football team. Previous to this she played for 2 years with Lowick United Girls. Her commitment involves travelling 3 times per week to train at Sunderland and again on Saturdays to play home matches at Gateshead/Sunderland to either play home matches or forward travel farther afield alongside all her schoolwork. Funding would apply to kit sponsorship, yearly fees to Sunderland Foundation and travelling expenses.

The Clerk had forwarded details to all councillors, received replies and forwarded to Jon Goodwin of the Community Fund so he could check it over before attending the next Parish Council meeting. However he had to send apologies but emailed his comments and advice for the Councillors to discuss and agree on. As Megan is currently an amateur he agreed that there could be a grant offered in support of the cost of the kit although it would not be able to be called 'sponsorship' her fees and some travel expenses.

After discussion it was agreed to offer Megan £1000 towards her kit, subscription and travelling costs. The clerk will contact Mr Goodwin so he can authorise payment.

**MATTERS ARISING**

**Traffic Calming measures in Fenwick** – Unipart Dorman, the preferred supplier of NCC for the speed signs sent details and costs which the clerk forwarded to all councillors. All were in favour of having two posts one at each end of the village with one battery powered sign to rotate between the posts with the data collection an important option. At the meeting all these details were confirmed plus the addition of red / green flashing lights to warn traffic of approaching too fast or whether they were within the speed required. Mrs M Murray had forwarded the details to County Councillor Roderick Lawrie who had agreed that data collection was good to have and confirmed by email he would fund it all. As this had been a few weeks ago Mrs Murray agreed to contact him again, confirm and accept his generous offer so he can authorise payment.

**Manor House Disturbance** - The Parish Council have not had any more information from Mr Wilson nor had heard anything more from the residents of Fenwick.

**Behaviour at Cheviot Trail Race** - Mr McWilliams had replied to the clerk's email with apologies and asked if the village hall would be available to use. The Clerk replied explaining that it was a now a private residence and thought the best way forward would be portals.

**Obstacles at Beal Shore** - Mr R Smith had contacted the Parish Council to let us know the state of play with regard to the obstacles at Beal foreshore following the publication of the recent newsletter. He stated that Natural England had a lease on the foreshore which they didn't renew and the County Council have never had any communication with him. Mr Smith will be thanked for putting light on the situation and offered our help to alleviate the situation should he need it.

### **INTERNET AVAILABILITY**

Mr Derek Eltringham, along with Mr I Bottomley have been pioneering to get better and faster internet access using a wireless based principle. Using a pilot group of Kyloe and Kentstone they have looked at the offering of two businesses, Alncom and Borderlink, with Alncom coming out as the chosen provider. Alncom already has a transmitter on Holy Island and line of sight will be used to transmit to an aerial which has been fixed onto the top of the church tower with another one at West Kyloe. Kentstone will use a transmitter from the Duns area. For installation into private residences, a voucher system will be in place with a 12 month contract and costs will be £1 per megabit. Mr Eltringham will do an article for the next newsletter.
