98. Apologies for Absence

Apologies for absence were received from councillors Ewens, and Johnston.

99. Minutes

The minutes of the meeting held on 29 October 2020 were confirmed as a correct record to be signed by the Chair when appropriate.

100. Issues raised by members of the public

Members noted concern of residents regarding the need for Link Road resurfacing and also the number of bins and potentially untaxed cars in the back lanes.

101. Police Matters

Members received crime stats which had also been posted on the Facebook page.

102. Havannah Nature Reserve

Work to upgrade the footpaths was to be undertaken soon. There were encouraging signs of a return of red squirrels.

103. Climate Emergency

There was nothing new to report.

104. Environment, Highways and Planning Issues

With reference to the planning application for Great Park CELL B1, an objection had been submitted. It was noted that the Brunton Quarry development was now 156 houses which was resulting in traffic problems.

Road sweeping was not being carried out on Coach Lane towards Dinnington.

New self-build properties being built in CELL C had not been part of the approved plan.

Members noted that recycling bins would not be provided by the City Council. There would also be no additional litter bins provided.

105. Website

Members approved the payment of membership fees to NALC and the annual maintenance fee for a new website hosted by NALC.

106. Financial Matters

Having considered Estimates for the new financial year, members agreed a Precept of £7,500 for the year 2021/2022

107. Issues raised by Members

- It was agreed that the litter picking equipment held at the Community Centre be offered should volunteers come forward to litter pick in the village.
- The planters would be refurbished with remaining funds.
- The Community Centre had a new roof and efforts would now be made to seek funding for improvements to the kitchen and electrics throughout the Centre. The Chair congratulated councillors Fairley and Garbett on their efforts during lockdown in supporting the local community.
