The map on the next page shows the proposed route.

The route links the following proposed key places and interpretation to include:

- Ovingham Community Orchard
- Tyne riverside paths – with interpretation from local schools and Tyne Riverside Trust
- New planting along Coal Lane – with interpretation on community Queens’ Green Canopy and Climate Action
- Joiners Nature Park – with interpretation on community life (past and present)
- New planting along St Andrews Lane - with interpretation on landscape features
- Restored ancient meadows at Whittle Dene
- Whittle Dene CIC proposed nature walk – to incorporate heritage woodland skills
- Whittle Dene CIC restoration of old mill as a visitor attraction
- Northern route (in purple) to feature key native species and how to identify – Aspen, Hornbeam, Sweet Chestnut, Field Maple etc. plus Horse Chestnut (introduced to UK c1600) .
- Whittle Dene – Woodland Trust site – interpretation on woodland management
- Identification of ancient / notable trees alongside route down from Overdene to end of St Andrews Lane
