Extract from the Draft Minutes of Ford Parish Council meeting.

Tuesday 9th November 2021 at 7pm in Etal Village Hall.

- 2. Members present Cllr Baker Chairman, Cllr. Clark, Cllr. Beattie Vice chairman, Cllr. Musgrave, Cllr. Keating, Steve Taylor Clerk, John Docherty Member of public
- 6. Matters arising from previous minutes.
- a) Grit Bins. The clerk reported that NCC were going to look at the damaged grit bins which he had reported but they were not able to fill any bins that the Parish Council might provide in the future. Councillors agreed that they could not take on the responsibility of filling grit bins so they were not in a position to purchase any more.
- b) Heatherslaw Bridge. The clerk reported that he had not heard anything back from NCC following on from his request for them to look at the condition of the bridge.
- c) Free trees. Bob Nevins, Forestry Manager for Ford and Etal Estates had responded to say that the Estate had decided that they had a good coverage of trees and they would rather leave them available for areas of the county that would benefit more from them. Councillors considered whether they should apply for some trees but decided against it and not take this any further.
- d) Cllr. Beattie reported that he had had no response to a request for a community speed check scheme in Crookham village. He will try to chase this up
- 7. Police report

PC Hornsby asked for the following to be brought to councillor's attention:-

Please could dog owners keep their dogs on leads around live stock. There has been a recent incident where a dog has not been kept under control and a sheep has been killed.

Sheep killing/worrying is an offence and it is the responsibility of the owner to control their dog. Worrying sheep causes them an enormous amount of stress which can lead to the sheep dying of shock. This also prevents them from breeding and to miscarry. The clerk said that he would try to get this put in the next edition of the Fourum newsletter.

8. Queen's Platinum Jubilee Beacon – 2nd June 2022

Councillors discussed whether the PC could do something to mark the occasion either by planting a tree, installing a bench or promoting some kind of event such as a Garden Party or Street Party. It was agreed that councillors would think about this and keep the item on the agenda of the next meeting in January.

9. Council vacancies

There are currently three vacancies on the Parish Council. Councillors agreed that the best way of recruiting people onto the council was to speak to them directly. The clerk will include an item in the Fourum newsletter with a specific request to try to find someone who might represent Ford village.

10. EBDA awards 2021

Cllr. Beattie suggested nominating The Fourum newsletter. Councillors supported his suggestion and Cllr. Beattie agreed to fill in the nomination form. Cllr. Clark suggested also nominating The Lavender Tearooms at which point Cllr. Baker declared an interest and withdrew from the discussion. Councillors also supported this suggestion and Cllr. Clark agreed to fill in the nomination form.

11. Budget 2022-23. To consider the budget report and set a budget for 2022-23

The Budget report was read out by the chairman. Councillors considered the budget and discussed raising the clerk's wages, reducing the amount of contingency and amount included for repairs and improvements, checking to see if the insurance was fixed for another year and increasing the precept. It was agreed that the clerk should set out these options on the spread sheet and circulate to councillors so that they could see the figures. A final decision on the budget would be taken at the meeting in January.





Advice from The Berwick Advertiser December 1921

Christmas is a time when goodwill and unselfishness should reign. Everybody should try and do something not for themselves, but for somebody else. If you make this the rule happiness will take care of itself.

Christmas Cake 1941 style

The recent news reports about the shortage of lorry drivers and the knock on effects of empty shelves in some supermarkets made me think about the wartime generation and how they coped with the scarcity of everyday items. It seems they weren't easily daunted, and period newspapers provided no end of advice on how to prepare traditional Christmas treats in the midst of rationing, which they claimed tasted every bit as good as their pre-war counterparts. So, here's a wartime Christmas cake recipe from 1941, try it and see what you think.



Christmas Cake (without eggs)

10ozs flour, 4ozs margarine, 4ozs sugar, 8ozs each of currants and sultanas, 4ozs raisins (chopped), ½ teaspoon salt, 1 tablespoon golden syrup, ½ teaspoon mixed spice, 3 teaspoons baking powder, 1 dessertspoon vinegar, ½ pint milk, peel of an orange finely chopped.

Mix together flour, salt baking powder and spice, then rub in margarine. Add all dry ingredients and mix well. Bind with syrup and milk mixed together and slightly warmed. Lastly stir in the vinegar. Turn at once into a lined and greased 7 inch cake tin and bake in a moderately slow oven for 3 ½ to 4 hours. Blanched split almonds 20zs, may be used to decorate the cake and should be added after the cake has been in the oven for 15 minutes. Apparently the taste is marvellous, enjoy!
