The Bamburgh Run 2023

The Bamburgh Run takes place this year on Sunday June 11th.

It is an annual event for motorcycles made before 1948. In its early years it started from Bamburgh Castle – hence the name of the event. Since 2017 the event has been based at Etal. The village provides a perfect setting for the start and finish of the Bamburgh Run, and the organisers (the Reivers Section of the Vintage Motor Cycle Club) are grateful for the wonderful cooperation of the Estate and the villagers.

The event consists of a road run with options of a 'short' route about 55 miles and a 'long' route of around 75 miles around north Northumberland.

One important feature of the run is the long tea stop, where spectators can mix with the bikes and riders and enjoy tea and cake. As in 2022, this year's tea stop is at the Cheviot Centre, in Wooler, where the refreshments will be provided by the ladies of Roddam WI

In 2023, the oldest machine currently entered is a 1913 Lincoln Elk and the newest is a 1945 BSA M20.

Entrants assemble at Etal from about 09:00 and the run starts at 10.30. Arrival at Wooler is from about 11.30. Spectators are most welcome at both locations! The riders arrive back at Etal at around 14.00 and the bikes are put on display beside the Village Hall while the riders enjoy lunch.

From a rural perspective there has been some machinery theft and some targeting of rural businesses. Locals were asked to remain vigilant and to report any concerns. The importance of personal safety was highlighted and individuals should not place themselves at risk in an attempt to secure evidence or prevent a crime.

Cllr. Baker was elected chairman and. Cllr. Beattie was elected vice chairman The chairman signed Declaration of Acceptance of Office of chairman form. **Co-option to fill vacancies on the Council.** Marie Brown was duly co-opted and signed the Acceptance of Office form which was witnessed by the clerk. The Declaration of Pecuniary Interests form will be completed and returned to NCC.

Approve minutes of the council meeting held on 7th March 2023 – These were approved and signed by the chairman.

- Heatherslaw Bridge- A letter of concern was sent to Ann Marie-Trevelyan MP. This has generated a response from technical services at NCC who have agreed to review the required short term repairs to the bridge.
- Grit bin at Ford this was reported and an automated response received. The bin has not yet been replaced. The clerk will chase this up with NCC.
- Notice board at Ford this has been reviewed by Rosanna McCorkell who has confirmed the height of the board is acceptable and no further action is required.



HALL TO COMMEMORATE PEACE.



We give a sketch of the quaintly picturesque hall which Col. the Hon. H. E. Joicey has gifted to the village of Etal to commemorate Peace. The sketch only gives an impression of the outside of a building which internally is one of the most up-to-date, if not the most up-to-date, if not the most up-to-date village hall in the district. As mentioned last week, the hall has a billiard table, library, and comfortable ingle neuks for those using it, and there is a wireless set, which works two loud speakers when required.

Etal Hall Heritage project

It is astonishing to learn that a crowd of almost 250 people came along to the official opening ceremony of the Etal Peace Commemoration hall on January 6th 1926, as reported in the Berwick Advertiser and Berwick Journal on Jan 7th. It was a pretty significant event, "never to be forgotten in the lives of the villagers of Etal". In the Berwick Advertiser the following week the sketch on the left was printed, again extolling the virtues of this wonderful new "modern" building.

At the opening ceremony, led by Colonel Hugh Joicey, the hall received a blessing from the Reverend C.C. Harper, who then played an exhibition billiards match against the Colonel's wife. To the delight

of the company, she beat him by two points! Speeches were made by Colonel Joicey, and by Mr. Weatherhead the secretary, treasurer and librarian. Colonel Joicey made it clear to those assembled that, contrary to local rumour, the hall would definitely be available for dancing. In point of fact, the billiard table had been set on rails deliberately so that it could easily be moved into an alcove to make room for dancing.

The inauguration of the hall concluded with a Whist Drive with 31 tables participating. The prizes for winners included a case of teaspoons, a trinket box, a thermos flask, and a pipe - all kindly donated by Colonel Joicey.



The June Fourum Crossword by Gromwell


