An Angel Returns to Ford Village

After an absence of two-and-a-half years the statue of the Archangel Michael is returning to top the towering column at the centre of the Waterford Memorial in the heart of Ford village. This beautiful statue was designed by the famous architect Sir George Gilbert Scott, who also created the Albert Memorial in London's Hyde Park. It was erected in 1864 and has stood over Ford village, part of Ford & Etal Estates, for just over 150 years.

The Waterford Memorial was dismantled in October 2021 after an inspection revealed that there was significant damage to both the granite plinth and the limestone capitol which supports the angel figure.

The statue and column were transported to Edinburgh for renovation in the care of Graciela Ainsworth Sculpture Conservation Ltd. Further examination revealed that the damage was far worse than originally suspected and that repairs would take longer and cost far more than anticipated. Painstaking work has been undertaken to restore and reinforce the stability of the monument. This has included reversing the effects of weathering, removing organic growth and restoring the brass memorial plaques.

This essential work has been made possible with generous funding from The Pilgrim Trust. This contribution has enabled Ford & Etal Estates and the Lady Waterford Hall Trust to continue its commitment to maintaining Lady Waterford's work for public enjoyment and in sustaining her memory.

This is only the second time the statue has come down in its history; in 1868, just four years after it was erected, the area was hit by a large hurricane and both column and statue crashed to the ground. Fortunately, the collapse occurred within school hours so all the local children were out of harm's way in the nearby schoolhouse and no one was injured. The central shaft was reinforced, and the statue replaced, now standing proud for just over 150 years.

The Waterford Memorial was erected by Lady Louisa Waterford in memory of her husband Henry de la Poer Beresford, 3rd Marquis of Waterford, who died in a hunting accident in Ireland in 1859, leaving his wife a widow at just 40. Lady Waterford moved to Ford and devoted the rest of her life to improving the estate for her tenants, constructing the school, now known as Lady Waterford Hall, and laying out Ford village in its present plan. She spent 21 years painting her famous series of Pre-Raphaelite murals, using local people as models. These were hung in the schoolroom to bring to life the bible stories taught to the children. Although the statue and column were returned to Ford in late Spring, 2023, it has been necessary to wait for final works to be undertaken. Graciela Ainsworth is due to commence work to restore the statue to pole position in early March and it is predicted that works will be completed in April. The Waterford Memorial is now in the care of The Lady Waterford Hall Trust, a charity which conserves the Hall for the benefit of the public. The Trust supports Louisa Waterford's commitment to education, telling the story of her life, her artistic and philanthropic work and the remarkable memorial she commissioned in memory of her beloved husband.

Lady Waterford Hall is open to the public daily (11:00-17:00) from 25th March until 3rd November, 2024. There are no admission charges in 2024. The Waterford Memorial stands nearby.
